## Subsequent adjustments (1980 - 1983)

In 1980, the Standing Commission, under the new chairmanship of the Hon Sir S Y Chung, CBE, JP, took a further look at the upper end of the Master Pay Scale and equivalent points on the Disciplined Services Pay Scale in the light of the outcome of the directorate pay review conducted at around the same time. It was recommended in the Second Report on Civil Service Pay (Report No. 5 of the Standing Commission, October 1980) that minor adjustments be made to the value of the increments above MPS point 45 and DPS(O) point 31 to arrive at the new maximum MPS point 51 and DPS(0) point 37 respectively, having regard to the likely minimum of the directorate.

2. The rank scales affected by the recommendations have been revised, with retrospective effect from 1 October 1979, as follows :-
