TYPES OF JOB-RELATED ALLOWANCES APPLICABLE TO THE DISCIPLINED SERVICES

(A) Extraneous Duties Allowance (Supplementary Duties) - there are three separate levels of payment in accordance with the degree of skill required:

Level 1 - payable to staff for performing supplementary duties or additional responsibilities requiring little or no special skill. The standard rate is 5% of MPS point 1 (\$135):

CSD Assistant Officers I/II on physical education duties

C&E Customs Officers/Senior Customs Officers in Anti-Smuggling Divisions who are qualified and are regularly engaged in the use of breathing apparatus

Rank & File on Photographer II duties

RHKPF Rank & File who have passed an elementary test in music and who are on Bandsman duties

Rank & File who have passed an elementary test and are engaged full-time as finger-print workers

Rank & File at Police Tactical Unit, Fanling who have passed the cooking course at PTS and are on cooking duties

Level 2 - payable to staff for performing supplementary duties or additional responsibilities requiring some skill or the passing of a test. The standard rate is 7.5% of MPS point 1 (\$203):-

CSD Rank & File on full-time driving duties

Rank & File on Photographer I duties

Assistant Officers I/II working as supervisors of Electrical Workshops at Stanley Prison

Assistant Officers I on construction and maintenance duties

Assistant Officers II on general nursing duties in various work locations

Level 3 - payable to staff for performing supplementary duties or additional responsibilities requiring specialised skills or the passing of an advanced test. The standard rate is 10% of MPS point 1 (\$270):-

CSD Rank & File on bus driving duties

FSD Rank & File competent to drive all vehicles (excluding ambulances) in Group I & II, and to operate all types of mobile pumps and airport appliances, and engaged on regular driving duties

RHKPF Rank & File who have passed the advanced driving test and are engaged on regular driving duties

Water Team members of the Special Duties Unit who in addition to the five-week diving course using compressed air have passed a higher-standard four-week diving course using pure oxygen and are engaged in regular diving duties

The detective allowance, as it is commonly known, is paid in recognition of the impracticability of staff engaged on detective duties claiming reimbursement of numerous small out-of-pocket expenses on items such as travelling, meals, refreshments, cigarettes and token signs of hospitality.

(E) Special Allowances - the circumstances under which Special Allowances are paid vary and there are no standard rates, the amount to be paid depending on the merits of each case. In the disciplined services, the only Special Allowance granted is:-

Note (4):

The Special Duties Unit was established in 1977 for counter-terrorist activities. The payment of a special allowance to Police Officers of the Unit is in recognition of the arduous physical training they must undergo, the extreme hazards in their operational duties, the need to maintain exceptional standard of performance, and to remain on 24-hour call.
