CHAPTER VI

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 105. We recommend:
- (a) that the salaries in Appendix A be paid to superscale/upperscale officers in the executive departments;
- (b) that the salaries in Appendix D be paid to judicial/legal officers;
- (c) that the 'grading' of departments be abolished;
- (d) that education allowances and children's allowances be paid to superscale officers on a reducing scale ranging from 90% of the allowances at the bottom of the superscale and disappearing completely for salaries of \$6,800 p.m. and upwards;
- (e) that consideration be given to the restriction of first-class air passages to heads of department and officers of similar status;
- (f) that our terms of reference be amended to omit the 'grading' of departments and the expression 'upperscale';
- (g) that the effective date of the proposed increases be 1st September, 1964.
